## Shared Lives



### Winner – Kerryann Meehan

Kerryann Meehan is supported by her Shared Lives carers Sandra and Stephen in Irvine, Ayrshire. **In September 2022, Kerryann found out that she was going to become a Mum!** With support from Sandra and Stephen Kerryann attended many health appointments, including those with her safeguarding midwife, regular baby growth scans and classes to learn how to bath, feed and make up baby bottles. On the 22nd of May, Kerryann gave birth to a healthy baby girl called Lily weighing 6 lbs and 10 ounces. Both mum and baby were well, and it was a shared special, emotional, and proud moment for everyone involved. Since then, Kerryann has continually proved to be an incredible mum who always puts her daughter first!

### Runner up – Duncan Murray

Duncan lives in the Scottish Borders and has a passion for the great outdoors.

After a placement gardening at a local estate, he was accepted onto a gardening apprenticeship with Scottish Borders Council. During this time, he attended college which involved (with the support of his carers Doreen and John Murray) a 6am bus taking him almost 20 miles! **Duncan received his MA Parks, Gardens and Green Spaces certificate and when his apprenticeship was ending, he saw a full-time position was available which he applied for and was successful in securing!** Duncan has been described by his nominator as an enthusiastic, hardworking, determined, and lovely natured young man and the Shared Lives community are enormously proud of everything he has achieved.

Wayne's nominator shared "Wayne put a lot of time and effort into preparing himself for the 18 mile Kiltwalk with his support practitioners. **He has shown improvements to his health and wellbeing and should be massively proud of his achievements.** Wayne really enjoys going to see different shows and would use his prize money to get tickets to see more!"

Rosheen set herself a fitness challenge and has been working hard to achieve her goals by attending her local gym and swimming twice a week. Rosheen can often be found out walking with her support practitioners to help reach her goal and like Wayne also took part in the Aberdeen Kiltwalk!

## Aberdeen South and Shire

### Winner – Lindsey Telfer

Lindsey has been supported by the Crudenlea team for over 12 years. She has always had a keen interest in keeping fit and active. Her limited mobility certainly does not stop her from working hard on her fitness goals.

**During the COVID lockdown Lindsey began working with a personal trainer doing weekly Zoom video calls. Lindsey worked hard and raised over £2,000 for Cornerstone, by walking a total of 9,975 metres in her walking aid, by taking on Captain Tom's Walking Challenge.**

Lindsey swims every week and has a new personal trainer who she trains with in the gym. She is always positive and willing to try new ways to adapt her workouts. Her personal trainer is incredibly pleased with how hard she works and how she is always up for trying new exercises. Spending time on her fitness has given her the confidence, ability, and drive to reach her goals and meet new people who share the same hobby.

Lindsey really enjoys fundraising and would love to complete more fundraising events such as the Kiltwalk in her wheelchair and Swimathons to continue to raise money for Cornerstone.

## Ayrshire

Due to a number of illnesses Jon spent six months in a rehabilitation ward where he worked hard to regain abilities that he lost. Upon leaving he became very reluctant to go out in his community. Jon has continuously challenged himself and pushed himself out of his comfort zone. He now regularly takes part in outdoor activities such as attending the weekly disco and getting his team to dance alongside him, taking centre stage at community karaoke, and showing off his fantastic pool skills. Jon has developed a great relationship with staff and other people we support within the community support service. **His independence has really grown whilst having a positive attitude and outlook upon life.**

### Runner up – Shannon Brannigan

Shannon has been receiving support from Cornerstone for five years. She built trust with her support staff who learned to read her body language and displays affection towards them. After COVID restrictions, Shannon struggled to take part in community activities again. Her support staff trialled respite care in the comfort of her home, which was a roaring success and Shannon now displays a huge increase in her independence and confidence.

**Shannon went on her first ever holiday where she loved the evening entertainment and roller-skating discos.** She now regularly goes on long bike rides, attends beach barbeques with new friends and loves water activities with her mum.



## Dundee, Perth, Fife and West Lothian

### Winner – Ryan Cormack

Ryan is supported by our Glebe Road Service and he has been nominated for a number of reasons. One huge achievement is that Ryan faced his fear of snakes by not only standing next to one but eventually touching it (!) on a visit to Deep Sea World, with the support of Emma.

Ryan also set himself the challenge of holding a barbeque party for his friends and family. He chose a date, made a guest list, created the invitations and decorations, and chose what food to cook for his guests.

Not only did Ryan set up and throw a spectacular garden party, he even helped with the clean up! Ryan's support staff have described him as cheeky, funny and a pleasure to be around.



### Runner up – Michael Norton

Mikie is supported by our Fod Street housing team and has been nominated for how well he has coped with changes within his support team. Usually, he feels safe with people who he has built relationships with, however due to quick changes he had to adjust to being supported by new staff members.

Mikie has been described as a star throughout this period and helped his new support staff by teaching them his communication style and how he likes to complete his household tasks. Mikie has continuously showed improvement in his confidence and social skills even taking staff to some of his favourite adventure spots such as South Queensferry, Costa coffee and even to the airport for a tour!

## Glasgow and East Dunbartonshire

### Winner – Eric Nicholson

Chatty Eric has been described as part of the fabric of his village where everyone knows him, and he knows everyone. Not shy of demanding work over the years, you could find Eric working in the laundry in the hospital, being a bottleman in his local pub or behind the counter in the local chip shop. Eventually Eric took on the role of paper shredder for the Glasgow Cornerstone office for around 10 years working in both the old Sydney Street office and our new Templeton office. 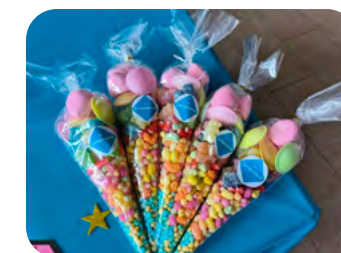
